Once again This Man reaches inside his cloak and places his ancient book on the table. With an eloquent turn of his hand, he opens to a page, and delves a little deeper into the earthlings' lives.

"In their beginnings Adam and Eve are perfect in mind body and spirit, living a holy life, modelled after God's most holy character."

And like all created beings before them, from their Creator Adam and Eve received everlasting life.

In today's world the concept of perfect, everlasting life can be difficult to imagine. Yet we know through this inspired book called the Bible, in their humanity Adam and Eve are " ... partakers of the divine nature..." 2 Peter 1:4

Like their Creator their deeds are righteous and good, their thoughts pure, their love selfless and noble.

"The wicked man does deceptive work, But he who sows righteousness will have a sure reward. As righteousness leads to life, So he who pursues evil pursues it to his own death." Proverbs 11:18-19

'See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil...' Deuteronomy 30:15

"He who keeps the commandment keeps his soul, But he who is careless of his ways will die." Proverbs 19:16

And so embracing the King's plan for their lives, and with His blessing, Adam and Eve become custodians of Planet Earth.

"Then God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." Genesis 1:28

"When I consider Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, The moon and the stars, which You have ordained, What is man that You are mindful of him, and the son of man that You visit him? For You have made him a little lower than the angels, And You have crowned him with glory and honour. You have made him to have dominion over the works of Your hands; You have put all things under his feet, All sheep and oxen - even the beasts of the field, The birds of the air, And the fish of the sea That pass through the paths of the seas. And in the wider sphere of universal life, Planet Earth is linked to other worlds orbiting in God's vast creation. Just as the great King has always been open and honest before the universal family, He shall remain open and honest before this new race of created beings, the human race. Even the existence of evil in the universe shall not be hidden from the fledging earthlings.

OUR VERY FIRST ANCESTORS, Adam and Eve walked and talked with God in their beautiful home in the Garden of Eden. A privilege we can only dream of.

But something happened, and these beautiful spiritual sights were hidden from Adam and Eve for the rest of their lives. They were the only humans to see God on a daily basis and speak with Him face to face.

But just because we cannot see God, does not mean He is not real. We simply cannot see Him. Instead of sight, we have faith in God: We believe He is there. *"For we walk by faith, not by sight."* 2 Corinthians 5:7

Through our faith, we communicate with God through prayer – talking with God through His only begotten Son Jesus Christ. And through our faith, we can meditate - thinking about and visualising God, His ways of working, His truth.

But did you know that prayer and meditation change our brains and our immune systems? Dr Andrew Newberg, in the United States, has mapped thousands of brains through a scanning technology called single photon emission computed tomography (SPECT). He is also a pioneer in the emerging science field called "neurotheology".¹

His work shows that when praying, people who believe in God consistently activate areas of the brain in the same way as if they were having a conversation with another person in the room: Their frontal lobes (just behind the forehead) light up, showing they are attentive and concentrating, and the language centre of the brain lights up too. ² When atheists (those who think there is no God) are asked to meditate or "contemplate God", their brains fail to activate much at all. ³

Dr Newberg's research into meditation shows one big difference compared with prayer. During meditation, the brain decreases activity in one specific area, the parietal lobes during mediation. This is the area where a person thinks about "self" and their individuality. ⁴

Another neuroscientist, Richard Davidson also in the USA, says one study showed mediation changes people's brains in just two weeks. Another similar study showed systematic change in both the brain as well as improving the immune system with just a few minutes meditation a day for just two months. The subjects developed more antibodies to a flu virus than those who didn't meditate.⁵

Let's allow Dr Newberg to have the last word: "The more you focus on something — whether that's math or auto racing or football or God — the more that becomes your reality, the more it becomes written into the neural connections of your brain."⁶ What do you want to focus on today?

Who formed it to be inhabited: 'I am the Lord, and there is no other. I have not spoken in secret In a dark place of the earth ... I, the Lord, speak righteousness, I declare things that are right.''' Isaiah 45:18-19

But secretly someone else is thinking very different thoughts, someone not so honest, and someone with a very different purpose in mind than God's purpose of love.

Oh yes, appearing in the shadows of his own darkness, Lucifer the fallen angel now *called the Devil and Satan*, seizes the occasion to exalt himself above God's holy law. *Revelation 12:9*

Now you may remember back in the beginning of universal time Lucifer was the leading angel in heaven serving in God's government.

"...Lucifer, son of the morning!" Isaiah 14:12

But sadly Lucifer began to harbour resentful thoughts toward the great King and Son.

Lucifer wanted to become one with them and enter into their divine council. Of course this could never become reality for God the Father and Son are the divine Creators. Lucifer is merely a created being of lower life. Slowly but surely Lucifer's wild fantasies escalated into open rebellion against God's authority and governing rule.

"The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life..." Psalm 119:172

As the tree of life mirrors God's righteousness it also reflects God's commandments.

"For all Your commandments are righteousness." Psalm 119:172

By keeping the commandments Adam and Eve are living the very essence of God's righteousness - His goodness - and this entitles them to eat from the tree of life and live forever.

"Blessed are those who do His commandments, that they may have the right to the tree of life..." Revelation 22:14

And partaking of the tree of life Adam and Eve receive God's knowledge of wisdom into their lives.

"...the excellence of knowledge is that wisdom gives life to those who have it." Ecclesiastes 7:12

"... the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy." James 3:17

"Happy is the man who finds wisdom, And the man who gains understanding; For her proceeds are better than the profits of silver, And her gain than fine gold. She is more precious than rubies, And all the things you may desire cannot compare with her. Length of days is in her right hand, In her left hand riches and honor. Her ways are ways of pleasantness, And all her paths are peace. She is a tree of life to those who take hold of her, And happy are all who retain her." Proverbs 3:13 -18



The tree of life grew...

"...fine branches that shaded the forest, And of high stature; And its top was among the thick boughs The waters made it grow; Underground waters gave it height, With their rivers running around the place where it was planted, And sent out rivulets to all the trees of the field. Therefore its height was exalted above all the trees of the field; Its boughs were multiplied, And its branches became long because of the abundance of water, As it sent them out. All the birds of the heavens made their nests in its boughs; Under its branches all the beasts of the field brought forth their young; And in its shadow all great nations made their home. Thus it was beautiful in greatness and in the length of its branches, Because its roots reached to abundant waters. But in the lives of those who are obedient, the commandments nurture and protect life.

"In the way of righteousness is life, And in its pathway there is no death." Proverbs 12:28

...If you want to enter into life, keep the commandments.' Matthew 19:17

"For all Your commandments are righteousness." Psalm 119:172

"Treasures of wickedness profit nothing, But righteousness delivers from death." Proverbs 10:2

By God's overruling decree, the tree of the knowledge of good and evil is the only place on Planet Earth where Satan can infiltrate the new world with sin. Thus standing as a wall of defence, Adam and Eve are Planet Earth's first guardians, to ward off all temptation to eat the deadly fruit.

"All unrighteousness is sin..." 1 John 5:17

"He who sins is of the devil, for the devil has sinned from the beginning." 1 John 3:8

"Now the works of the flesh (evil) are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries and the like..." Galatians 5:19-21

Can you see the fruit growing on *the tree of the knowledge of good and evil?* Yes, this supernatural tree bears seeds of good from God and seeds of evil from Satan. Life and death are side by side. *Genesis 2:17*
